

## Birthday Cake

On Thursday, 18 August, St John's D.S.G. celebrated their official 125th birthday with a big old fashioned birthday party, and what jamboree is complete without a beautiful cake! This incredible three tiered birthday cake was made by the very talented Mrs Carol Parsons (Assistant Catering Manager) and we thought it would be fun to share just how much went into creating a master piece such as this...

- The cake included 57 eggs, 2kg of butter, 8.2kg of icing sugar, 4.36kg of sugar and 3.9kg of flour.
- Over 6kg of fondant totalling 1.35m² was used.
- The base layer of the cake had the school branding specially printed onto 7 x A4 sheets of icing which were carefully cut to size to fit around the sides of the cake.
- The top tier was decorated with exactly 125 gold and white hearts.
- 🦃 9.3m of ribbon was used.
- The centre dowel (which was custom made by Mrs Parsons' husband) stood 60cm high and an additional 8 dowels were used through the cake to support it.
- When complete, the cake weighed an astonishing 30.9kg!

It was a magnificent evening with staff, parents, Old Girls and friends of the St John's D.S.G. community coming together to celebrate this momentous occasion in our special school's history.

### astoral Postscript by )r Bernice Borain

Re-joining St John's D.S.G. this year has been a homecoming in several ways. Despite only attending St John's D.S.G. for a short time in the 80s, I am reassured that this counts, thus, I find myself a proud Old Girl of the Junior Primary campus. I remember wearing a sea captain's hat, a magician's cloak, and still being terrified and impressed in assemblies by the discipline and order. There were nine of us in my class, and I remember this meant I was afforded far more attention by my teacher than I wanted.

Fast forward to this year, when I returned for a second time, in a pastoral role, working under Mr Moore's mentorship, to enhance relationship-building, leadership, discipline and inclusivity. In the latter portfolio, I have worked with our girls to forge ahead with work Sekwanele (Enough is Enough) started during the BLM movement.



ou will remember the survey data compiled by conversation strategist, Nozipho Tshabalala, and her husband, Rorisang Tshabalala, and since then, our 2022 head girls have been instrumental in helping us form and name the new inclusivity advisory body, Sisonke. The Representative Council of Learners attend with a balance of learners and staff. The staff come from every part of our school - boarding, sport and academics, support and administration.

The purpose of this column is to tell you more about what Sisonke has been working on and to engage with you as much as we can. Our initial work centred on belonging and kindness. We have also considered more practical matters, collaborating on our inclusivity statement with girls and staff, and discussing whether we should consult the Heritage Committee to name buildings and other spaces to honour important people in our history.

Another practical issue has been navigating social justice issues in schools today. Our Christian Anglican ethos informs everything we do, and so too for this journey. Rev Di (St John's D.S.G. Chaplain) has been looking at biblical social justice, informing us of modern day slavery and foregrounding the predicament of the vulnerable quartet the poor, the widow, the orphan and the refugee. More recently, she has spoken on biblical truth, and that informs our pastoral vision.

The next step is to consult with you. Our Sisonke committee would like to rename the houses to more accurately reflect who we are and remove the colonial names of men who have little to do with our school, especially the disreputable Cecil John Rhodes. We believe we can do better and show our community and visitors more respect by finding names that align with our identity and values. We flew different African eagle names past the girls, but this idea did not take off. Unfortunately, more bad eagle puns are to follow as you will have noted that we were not successful in hatching this plan. So we need your help. One idea might be to simply strip the names down to their colours and allow the girls to choose a theme every year. The other idea is to use the founding sisters' surnames – for reasons that will be quickly apparent, their first names have been vetoed - Fanny Bayly, Anna Hermann and Margaret Lucas. Bayly is associated with berries (red), Lucas with light (yellow) and Hermann with warrior (blue). A few of us believe this is appropriate and more relevant than the current names. No other discussions have taken place with students yet, but they will soon, and we would like to engage with you on this too. Click here or scan the QR code to share your thoughts and ideas:

"We see ourselves as ensuring a good return on investment for our donors," says Ali, who has walked with Amathuba's 25 scholars for many years through her involvement with the Frank Jackson Foundation. Together with her team of 15 part-time mentors, they experience the magic of opportunity and the effect it has on the trajectory of generations.


